About

A fun fusible applique design in 2 sizes that can be stitched by hand or machine. Can also be made as a stitchery by tracing the design placement and back stitching over the marked lines. Display your finished work in a frame or make it onto a cushion.

Requirements

Background for small size: Cut a 10" (25 cm) square

Background for large size: Cut a 16" (40 cm square)

Different coloured fabric scraps for the applique, we used batik fabric.

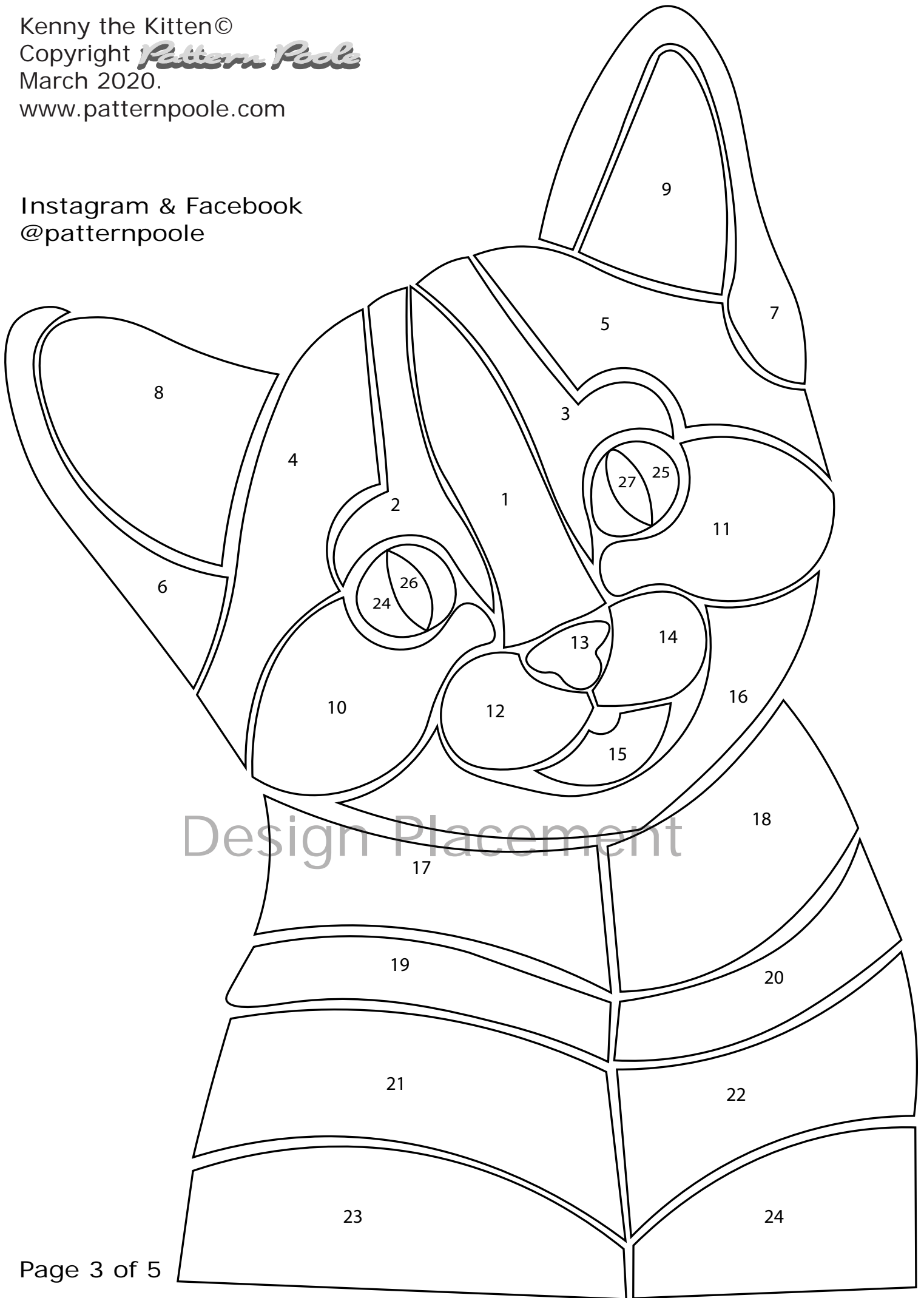
Fusible web to apply the shapes onto the background fabric.

Your choice of thread to stitch around the edge of the applique shapes.

Instructions

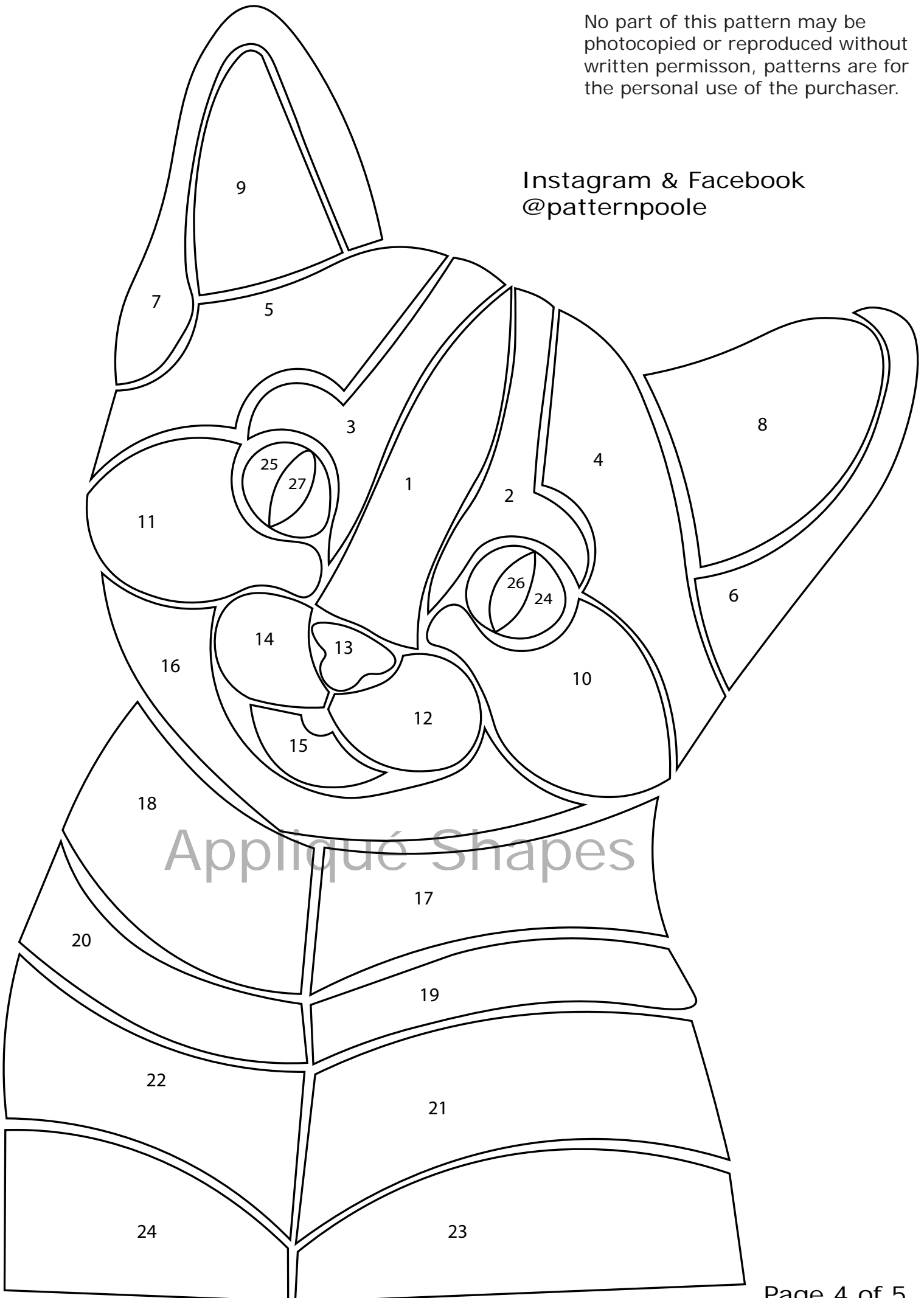
Print the pattern pages, making sure that you tick the ACTUAL SIZE BOX before you begin printing.

1. To transfer the position of the applique design onto the background fabric, place the design placement under the background fabric with the right side facing up. Centre the design under the fabric and hold in place with pins. Lightly trace the design using a fabric marker that can be easily erased from the fabric. You may need to hold the design up to a window or use a light box so that you can see the design through the fabric.
2. Using a lead pencil, trace the applique shapes onto the smooth side of the fusible web, leaving a space between each piece. The eyes are layered so trace each section separately and as a full piece. Number each piece. (Applique shapes are in reverse but will be facing the correct way once applied to the background fabric)
3. Roughly cut around the fusible web shapes, do not cut them out exactly just yet.
4. The next step is to have fun working out your colour combination, you can follow the sample picture as a guide or come up with your own original combination.
5. Iron the rough side of the shapes onto the wrong side of your chosen fabrics using a dry iron on the cotton setting. The shapes will fuse to the applique fabrics.
6. Cut each shape out neatly on the line.
7. Peel away the paper backing from the applique shapes and position them onto the background fabric using the numbers as a guide. Iron to fuse the shapes in place.
8. Stitch around the edge of the applique shapes by hand or machine using your preferred method.
9. When your applique is complete, simply mount it in a photo frame using a strong adhesive tape to secure it to the mounting board or make it into a cushion.

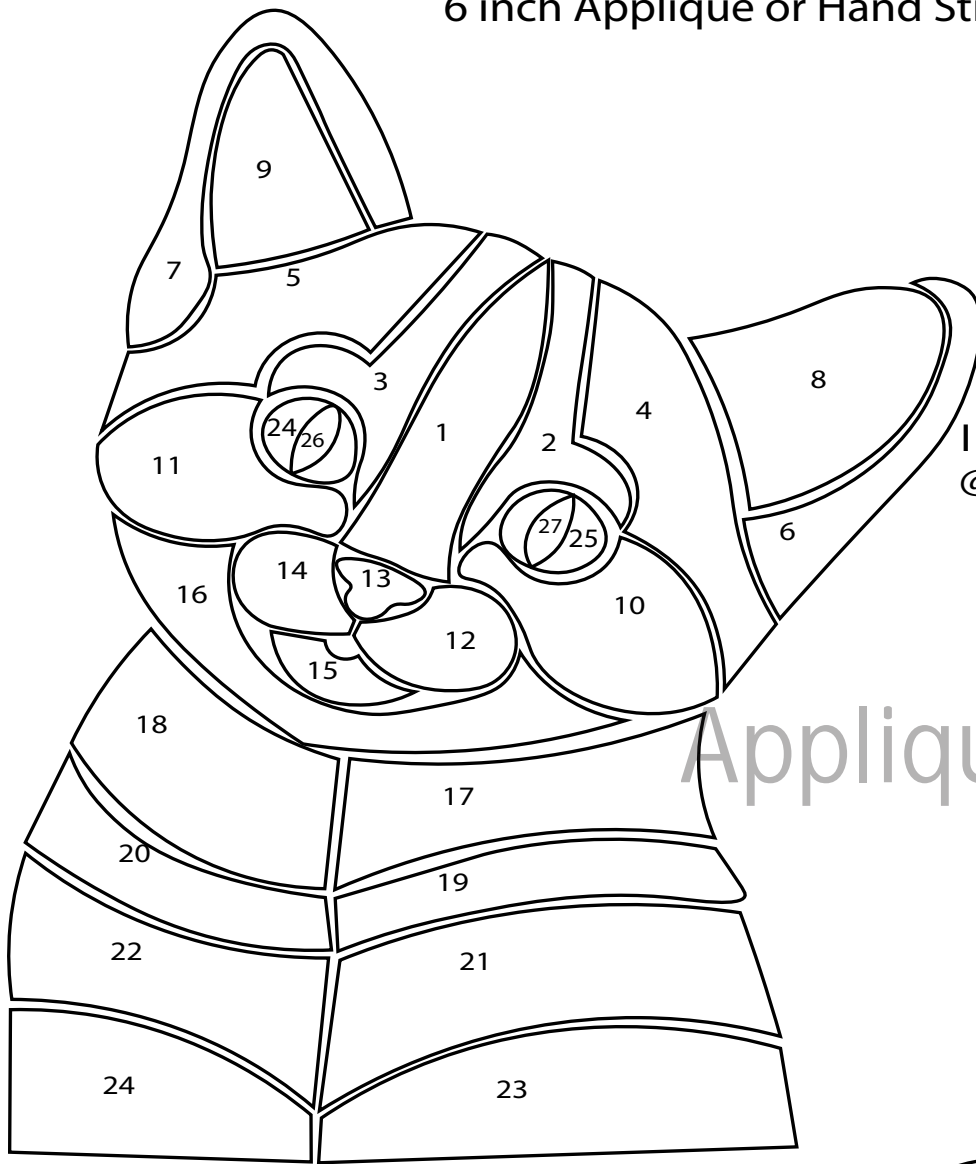

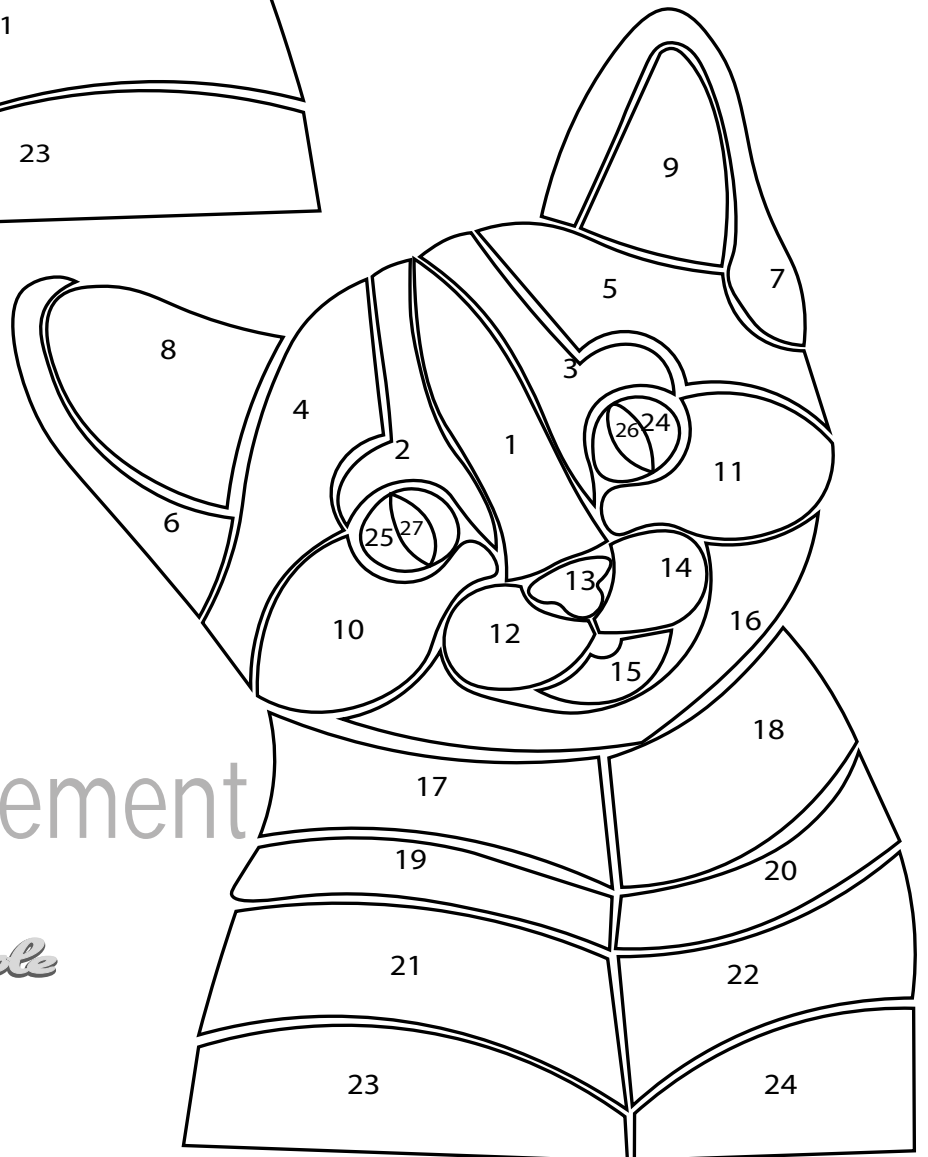


6 inch Applique or Hand Stitchery Design
